The meeting was called to order at 7pm by acting chairman Bob Riehl.

Introductions

Do it for Dustin Campaign – Stefani Freese reported on the campaign and the Streets and paths committee. They kicked off the do it for Dustin campaign on January 18th behind the First Interstate Bank of Lockwood. The first rally had an attendance of about one hundred. The goal is to reach every residence with a flyer and answer any questions. About half of the homes have been reached. It is planned to meet at the First Interstate Bank back-lot Saturday, Jan 25th and complete door to door campaign.

The ballots go in the mail on February 7 and are due back to the elections office on February 25th. A second appreciation rally is planned for February 1st in the Lockwood First Interstate Bank back-lot at 11 AM.

It was pointed out that the funds that this levy would raise go strictly to Lockwood improvements. The district would be administered by the county commissioners. The county charges no administrative fees for managing the special districts. The commissioners would be advised by a board or committee. These will be unpaid positions. It will be required that you be a Lockwood resident to serve. Thus all monies will go to benefit Lockwood.
